



REUSABLE MILK CONTAINER PLANTER







Fill the container with free draining soil (small gravel mixed with compost about 50:50) up to about 1 centimetre from the top

Plant your seed into the top of the soil and lightly cover the seed.

You can use a variety of seeds from your local area.

Make sure you do not collect all the seeds from under just one tree to make sure you get a variety of sources and to make sure you leave seeds for the local birds and animals





In the spring you will get a small sapling.


Leave it in this container and during the second winter once the leaves have dropped off, then plant it out into the wild. Clean out and wash, with a mild detergent the container and use it again for the next lot of seeds.

You can use the containers for years to come and it is a great way of recycling your milk containers

If space is short, or you just want to grow lots of saplings then why not make a rack for them or hang them on a wall.

The handle of the container is great to put a rod through or a piece of rope so you can hang the container up.

Vertical planting is a great way to save space and you can also grow a green wall using this system by planting lots of plant species such as ivy and ferns.

Vertical planting is a great way to save space and you can also grow a green wall using this system; why not plant hanging tomatoes or strawberries on a sunny wall.

Attach two sturdy hooks on the wall, feed the handles through a long rod and hang it on the wall. Allow enough room between each rod to hang the containers.
